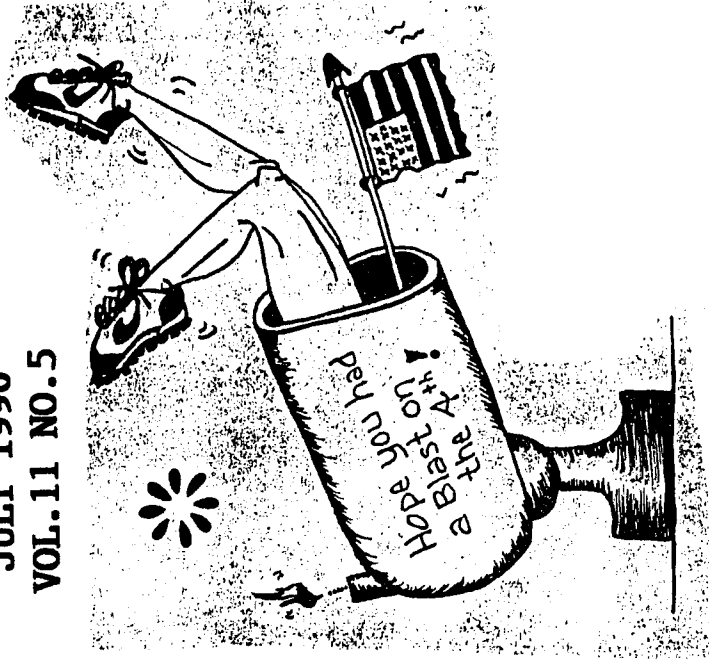

INJURIES...TRIATHLONS...AND FINDING A WILL TO HEAL

Injuries are a pain! I don't mean to be funny, because if you've been injured and prevented from running you what a frustrating time the lay-off can be. Probably one of the frustrating factors is not knowing why of how you injured yourself. There are those who keep records of their runs and can sometimes find a clue. But I think for most of us, we run according to how we feel, letting our bodies tell us how far to go. Obviously sometimes we don't listen very well. But it would be nice if our bodies would give us a little feedback. Just a little recollection of some slip, some different surface, different shoes, too many miles on too little rest??? What?

After a few weeks we just resign ourselves to not running, resting looking the other way when we see other runners on the roads( although I am tempted to trip them up. You know, it's the old "if I can't run why should you be able to" immature syndrome that tempts me!) and try to find other activities to consume our extra energy. Biking, swimming, walking, couch potatoing....But there comes a point when nothing else fits the daily routine, the energy consumption or gives you the exhausted satisfaction as a good run. It must be the time the injury is almost healed. If you venture out too soon you'll reinjure yourself. The thought of postponing the healing back a few weeks or month is usually enough to prevent any attempt to resume running. The will power to resist temptation gets stronger and soon...pretty soon...I will run again!

It's with these thoughts about injury and healing I ventured into the canoeing and biking portions of a recent triathlon. (Next year...I'll join Merrill in the Ironwoman ranks) I think I could almost become a bike racer. Almost...except for the expense of the equipment( and you thought running shoes were expensive!?) and I have no idea of what real bike racing is all about. I think I'll keep biking as one of my alternative interests! But the participation in the race was nice. It was great to be back among competitors! It also inspired me to heal completely, train smartly, LISTEN CLOSELY to my body from now on and plan for rest.

J.B. ran the 3.9 mile portion in under 30 minutes, but couldn't find my canoeing partner and I in the crowd. We tagged and splashed into the two mile paddle which who knows how long it took or how far we zigged and zagged! The I was off to peddle my 20-year old touring bike 12.5 miles. It was fun. We didn't even hang around for the results because they seemed less important than our enjoyment. This was our first The Great Race Triathlon in St. Albans but it won't be our last!

DAVIS CAPTURES 13TH CAPITAL CITY STAMPEDE 10K  
(state age-group records fall)

The 13th running of the Capital City Stampede 10K road race proved to be anything but unlucky for defending champion Sam Davis of East Calais; as he cruised to a 32:33 time to win on Saturday, June 9 in Montpelier. Sam bested a field of 121 runners on a humid, but overcast day. By taking 5 seconds off last year's pace Sam won by more than two minutes over second place finisher, Douglas MacGregor of Lebanon, NH.

It was MacGregor that impressed the field however, by blistering the course in 34:44 to set a new 50-54 age group record for the 10K in Vermont. MacGregor, at age 51 took 1:02 off the old record set by Bill Foulik in 1984 of 35:46.

Third place overall went to Montpelier's Edward McSweeney in a time of 35:18, which was good enough to win the 30-39 age group bracket.

The women's race was a sprint to the finish as Johanne Brus of Quebec, Canada out-kicked Sue Manley of Cambridge, Vt. to win in 39:47. Manley finished just four seconds back with a 39:51. The race for third was just as close as Barbara Capen of Starksboro nudged out a 40:02 time to defeat last year's second place finisher, Moira Burnin of Stowe by 4 seconds as well.

Capen's time set a new women's age-group record in the 40-44 year old category previously held by Jane Banks of Underhill Center. The old mark of 42:40 was set just last year at Capital City.

Besides MacGregor's and Capen's age group records, several other single age records fell this year. Burnin's time set a new 39 year-old mark, while McSweeney's time set the male record for the same age. Bob Murphy of Barre set a new mark for 50 year-olds with a 38:40; Tim Cunningham of Hartland 4 Corners, at 58 years-old set the mark at 44:07; and Don Lyons of Montpelier set a new mark of 50:55 for 64 year-olds.

Other age group winners included: Patty Roach-Davis in the 18-29 category with a 41:13 and Darragh Ellerson in the 50-59 for women with a 51:26. Andrew Skea won the male 13-17 group with a time of 42:21 and Jonn Valentine the 40-49 age group with a 36:13.



No major sponsor this year, so the donations are helpful. He's hoping for 75 Runners to make the race break-even (101 actually raced) 115 ran in 1989.

Chris says he's ready to tackle the Berlin Pond race. You should find an entry form someplace in this newsletter. Central Vermont Hospital will donate t-shirts. And as always he needs volunteers. That means YOU again.

Darragh says she has already received two applications for Leaf Peepers! She credits her ads in New England Runner and Running Times for the early response.

Now for new things happening... The Montpelier-East Montpelier Bicentennial Committee asked for our help in an International Friendship Relay race from Waterbury to Montpelier on August 23. The race starts in Ontario and involves Governor Kunin and Canadian government officials for the final mile into Montpelier. We agreed with Darragh, Polli and Tim to gather some CVR runners to participate. (Subsequently, Tim reports the Bicentennial Committee really wants CVR to organize the relay. Tim declined and offered our initial support of providing runners only.)

Bob Howe (recently nominated as club fashion supervisor) inquired about CVR singlets to have at races to sell, and possibly attract new members. Darragh will check with Porquaine graphics for our logo and Norm will check on price and supply of singlets at area stores.

Norm (former newsletter editor and news-bound) reports a new state sports monthly magazine is about to hit the newsstands. It will feature Vermont sports, aerobic sports only. It's called VERMONT SPORTS MONTHLY and is published out of Waterbury. It should have some CVR races news, so look for it.

MONTPELIER TEN MILE ROAD RACE (JUNE 23, 1990)

**DAVIS AND PFEIFER OVERALL WINNERS,  
MACGREGOR AND CAPEN SET MASTERS RECORDS**

Sam Davis and Kathy Pfeifer ran impressive times given the high humidity to win the overall men and women titles, and Doug MacGregor and Barbara Capen set Masters records, to highlight the 16th annual Montpelier Ten Mile Road Race on June 23. For the sixth consecutive year, the race served as the Eastern Regional Championship of the Road Runners Club of America.

Davis, of East Calais, emerged the victor in a tight three man duel in a time of 53:07. Randy Sightler of Winooski was close behind in 53:38, followed 23 seconds later by John Dowling of Warner, New Hampshire. MacGregor, 51 years old, from Lebanon, New Hampshire, topped his remarkable performance of last year. He was 5th overall, and set a Masters Male record in 57:32. Other male age group winners were Terence Paquette (17 and under), Sightler (30-39), Ed McSweeney (40-49), and Doug Allen (60+).

Pfeifer, of Burlington, turned in one of the few sub-one hour performances (59:29) ever by women on this course in finishing well ahead of her closest pursuer. The real race among women was for second place, with Lisa Schmidt of Proctorsville (63:26) edging Debbie Brunelle-Tirrito of Winooski (64:36). Barbara Capen, of Starksboro, broke the Masters Female record set last year by Jane Banks, finishing in 67:55. Other female age group winners were Schmidt (18-29), and Darragh Ellerson (50-59).

The host club, the Central Vermont Runners, fared very well in the team competition. CVR took home three of the four team titles, winning Open Male, Masters Male and Masters Female. Reebok-Endurance Sports was the Open Female team champion.

101 runners registered for the race, and 94 actually completed the distance. The weather was iffy, which is not unusual for this race. The temperature was around 70 degrees, but humidity was high. Skies mercifully were overcast for the entire race, and not a drop of rain fell until the last finisher crossed the line. Luckily, the starting time for the race was moved from 10:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. this year. By the time the awards ceremony started 20 minutes after the last finisher crossed the line, the heavens had opened in a torrential downpour. A 10:00 start would have meant most runners would have been running in such lovely conditions, to say nothing of the more than 20 race volunteers standing in the downpour.

The race had no major sponsor this year, so the support of the following businesses was much appreciated in defraying race expenses: Ben & Jerry's, First in Fitness, Gatorade, Kinney Drugs, Union River Sports, Runner's World and Stevens & Co. Thanks also to the Montpelier Recreation Department, who has been involved in this race since the beginning, and stepped forward this year to help sponsor it. Many, many thanks to the race volunteers who, to the last person, did a great job and cheerfully did more than they were asked. It was the best crew we have had in the six years I have directed the race. They are: Marcia Ackerly, Jo Ann Beaudin, David Ellerson, Greg & Karen Gerdel and their children, Linda Hallinger, Floyd Hewett, Bob Howe, Geoff Lindemer, Don Lyons, Dana & J.B. McCarthy and their children, Bob Murphy, Reidun Nuquist, Jerry Richardson, Norm Robinson and Jim Suskin. Special thanks to my wife, Annie, who stayed up late the previous night to bake muffins for the racers, and also served as race photographer.
