# **Vermont Special Olympics 2000**

The 2000 Vermont Special Olympics will be held at Middlebury College on Sunday June 11th. Competition for the Special Athletes with developmental disabilities is a very special time in the athletes' lives and for those who rally around to support the Special Athletes and Special Olympics. For the athlete with developmental disabilities, the Special Olympics experience is much more than the athletic training and competition. It is an important and life changing accomplishment.

Each year more than 450 Vermont law enforcement officers from over 80 different agencies take part in a three day long relay to pass the Special Olympics' "Flame of Hope" across the state of Vermont. The relays, from the four corners of the state, will converge in Middlebury on June 10th for the Opening Ceremonies of the 2000 Summer Games. Special Olympics of Vermont receives no government funding and is entirely dependent on donations to support its programs. No athlete ever pays a fee to participate. The law enforcement Torch Run is one of the premier fund raising events held to support Special Olympics. One way the law enforcement community helps raising money is by the sale of Torch Run t-shirts and comemorative Torch Run pins. The t-shirts are available for a \$15 donation and the pins are available for a \$5 donation.

These handsome t-shirts, available in sizes Small to XXL, are 100% cotton Fruit of the Looms by Lofteez. The shirts and pins will be available for inspection and sale at most Tuesday night Fun Runs.

You may be surprised to know that there are eleven (11) Montpelier High School students who will be participating in the Vermont 2000 Summer Games.

The Montpelier Police Department, a long time Special Olympics supporter, will be carrying the "Flame of Hope" from Montpelier to Waterbury on Friday June 9th. Additionally, two individual Montpelier officers and one 3-policeman team will be participating in the Special Olympics Mountain Challenge on Saturday June 10. The Mountainmen will be running from the intersection of Routes 100 and 125 in Hancock, up and over Middlebury Gap to the opening ceremonies in Middlebury some 21 miles to the west. National Life has made a generous donation to Vermont Special Olympics for this new event perhaps in an effort to rid the state of 36 of its finest.

The t-shirts and pins will be available at Fun Runs, the Special Athletes will thank you for your donation and you can proudly wear your Torch Run t-shirt on your next run.

## Secretary's Report

CVR is planning on sending at least one team, and maybe more to Lake Winnipeasukee, NH, for the 12th Annual Relay around the lake. This is a 66 mile relay race with 8 member teams. The legs vary in distance from 4.4 up to 11 miles. Cost is \$130 per team (\$16.25 per person) which includes a T-shirt. There are a number of different age/sex categories.

In the past we have taken several different teams. Usually we go for the fun and camaraderie, but we can put together a "fast" team if people are so inclined. Many of us make accommodation arrangements for the night before, after, or both. We have a cottage that we have used in the past, with a pool and outdoor hot tub. 
