Fun Runs







1994 CENTRAL VERMONT RUNNERS ANNUAL TREASURER'S REPORT

The Central Vermont Runners Club ended 1994 with a balance of \$2,489.42 in it's treasury. This is an increase of \$264.36 over year-end 1993. The result of the increase in due to two factors primarily. Our Administrative costs were nearly \$700 less than 1993, and the Leaf Peepers race netted almost \$562 more than 1993.

The newsletter expenses were nearly the same in 1994, but will most likely see an increase in 1995 due to postage increases.

While Leaf Peepers showed tremendous increases because of increased participation, and CVR getting more dollars per runner; the other races as a whole suffered financially.

The Capital City Stampede showed a loss of \$163.13, and the Montpelier 10 Miler likewise lost \$127.26. Juniper Hill showed a very slight loss as well.

The Berlin Pond Couples race showed a nice profit however, at \$154.10 versus a loss of \$9.85 in 1993.

CVR dues fell off just slightly in '94 from \$522 in '93 to \$493 in '94. We again spent \$500 on scholarships, joined RRCA and TAC, and bought our insurance from the RRCA. We did have a \$180.00 expense to cover CVR singlets in '94 that was a carry over from 1993.

A reminder that at annual meeting of 1993 the club voted to set aside \$1000 for future purchase of a race clock. That money is in the general fund and is included in the year-end balance.
