## Central Vermont Runners - Meeting Minutes

Tuesday, April 13, 1999

Club President Norm Robinson called the meeting to order. Treasurer Laura Medalie reported a current balance of approximately \$3.200. The majority of the current funds belong to the club and

are not accounts payable.

The meeting then turned to the 1999 race schedule. Donna Smyers reported on preparations for Mutt Strut and that she and Jamie would arrange with Darragh for all the necessary supplies. A portable toilet that is being subsidized the Mt.View Physicians group. A May 2<sup>nd</sup> community race that is receiving assistance from individual club members has acknowledged CVR assistance in print. There was a brief discussion of the importance, for insurance liability purposes, that only Club sanctioned races be listed as having CVR support or assistance.

The Kids' Track Meet is tentatively scheduled for June 5. Sam Davis will once again direct the Capital Stampede and Dave Kissner is set to head the 10 miler on June 12 and 26 respectively. Norm Robinson is assuming technical responsibility for the Montpelier 1 miler on July 4 and Michael Chernick will once again supervise the Berlin Pond 8 kilometer race on August

Turning to topics other than the race schedule, Dave Kissner demonstrated the new website prototype and reported that the site will be back up very shortly. The URL will be listed in the newsletter. It was decided to periodically mail out postcard reminders concerning fun runs and to add space for e-mail addresses to the club application

form. Donna Smyers will be conducting a clinic for new runners, and in a similar vein thought was given to a flyer for new runners.

Norm proposed that fun runs no longer be timed. But it was decided that the publicity gained from the weekly race reports was valuable for the club. The members in attendance voted to finance a new CVR Banner at a cost of approximately \$250.00. Nancy expressed interest in organizing a speed work out on Thursdays. The meeting adjourned at 8:41 P.M. and the next meeting will be held at Tim and Maureen's on May 18.

#### Tuesday, May 18, 1999

The Central Vermont Runners held a pot luck supper and business meeting on Tuesday May 18 at Tim Noonan's home. Attendance was small, consequently, the group decided that during the Fun Run season business meetings should not be held on Tuesday evenings. A brief and informal work session reviewed several topics.

The Kids' Track Meet, according to Tim, is on target for June 5 at Montpelier High School. Tim distributed flyers promoting the event and asked everyone to spread the word that volunteers are essential for the event's success. Once again, the Capital Stampede, on June 12, will be under the capable leadership of Sam Davis. Dave Kissner reaffirmed that the 10 miler, that he is directing on June 26, will use cards for tracking the runners places of finish. Tim also reported that Bear Swamp will be held on Thursday July 8 at 6:00 P.M. at the Rumney School in Middlesex. This is a new day and time for a long standing CVR summer favorite. Lastly, it was announced that there will be a Northfield 5K planning meeting at the Northfield Savings Bank on Tuesday June 1 at 7:00 P.M.

A Central Vermont Runners event at Little River State Park, Waterbury, Vermont to benefit the Central Vermont Humane Society

For the third year in a row, the weather was ideal for the Mutt Strutt. The women runners ruled the day. Caltin Compton, fresh from a successful season of nordic ski racing at the national level, was in shape to win - the only question mark was her 10-year old dog Clover. Clover kept pace and the pair topped the entire field in 19:00, beating their own course record for women of 19:20 set in 1997. Dot Martin and Kona, who edged out Caltin and Clover last year in the women's competition, were second overall in a fast 19:22. Former winners Tim Noonan and Gus were third overall and top men's team.
