CVR Summer

Busy season: CVR is winding down from its busiest season - staging 5 events in central Vermont in June and July - while gearing up for its biggest event, the Leaf Peepers Half-Marathon and 5K on October 3. Also, the Berlin Pond Couples Race (application in

this issue) and Northfiled Observances Races are fast approaching.

The summer season went quite well, with the established 10K and 10-mile races in Montpelier drawing their normal crowds (somewhat less than 100 runners each), and the new 1-mile race on the July 4 weekend slightly up in attendance over last year's innaugural race. The Kids' Track Meet in early June was down from last year's record crowd, but still had solid participation. The big surprise was the low-key Bear Swamp Race, which was moved to a Thursday night and attracted 48 runners, about double the norm of recent years. Race Director Tim Noonan was at a loss to explain the race's sudden popularity, but don't be surprised if the race is held in the evening again next year.

Heat and Humidity: If you've done well in road racing this summer, you must be immune to high temperatures. With the exception of the Bear Swamp Race, all the CVR races have been held under blazing sun and high humidity. A few CVR members who also ran the Boston Marathon and the Vermont City Marathon, which were also held on unusually hot and humid days, must be thinking they have somehow been transplanted to south Florida.

Request for Results: This is the first issue of the newsletter since early June. It contains mostly race results from CVR races. Some CVR members ran in the Cannonball Run on July 3 and the Stowe 8-miler on July 18. I ran out of time and space, but I will get these results in the next issue. If you have a race result from out of the area which I would not normally come across, please send it to me so I can include it in the newsletter. Central Vermont Runners

Minutes from meeting of June 23, 1999

CVR President Norm Robinson called the meeting to order at approximately 7:15 p.m. The discussion began with a review of the year's remaining races. Dave Kissner reported that preparations for the Montpelier Ten Miler were proceeding except that an administrative problem had arisen with Montpelier High School's assignment of facilities for the race. The school listed the club as having reserved the auditorium but neither restrooms nor lockers. There was also confusion regarding the \$100.00 fee for use of the auditorium and if this fee was intended to constituted the club's full payment for use of the school. Dave indicated that he would contact the school, arrange for the appropriate facilities and clarify the payment obligation.

Continuing into July, Norm Robinson related the Montpelier One Miler was on target for Saturday July 3 at 9:00 A.M. and that he would require materials and remaining sports beverage from Dave after the 10 miler. The always challenging Bear Swamp Run is scheduled for its new time and day on Thursday July 9 at 6:00 P.M. at the Rumney Middle School. Requests for applications are being received. Volunteers for this race are not needed. There will be an unstaffed water stop along the course. To date, there has not been any negative reaction to the change of day from Saturday to Thursday. It was announced that the Stowe 8 Miler is scheduled for Sunday July 18.

Plans for Berlin Pond were on course as of the meeting, but subsequently suffered a setback when Central Vermont Medical Center decided not to renew its sponsorship. The race will go forward without tee shirts for individual entrants but only for prize winners. As usual, the fantastic support provided by the Northfield Savings Bank assures that the Northfield 5k will once again be a successful event. The Northfield liaison committee will meet with representatives from the bank later in the summer.

The discussion then turned to Leaf Peepers. The Gang of ? has previewed the tee shirt and it received rave reviews. The entire planning process under the great coordination of Leslie Davis is moving forward. The gang will reconvene on Tuesday July 20 to continue the planning for the club's largest event.

With respect to other matters, Dave Kissner announced that the website is now functioning at www.cvrunners.org. The club has registered with the Secretary of State as a Vermont nonprofit. A new Federal EIN number has also been issued. While we have found the old sales tax purchase exemption number, it does not match with our new EIN#. There was discussion of filing an application for a new 501(c)(3). It was strongly suggested that Dot Helling carefully review any application before it is filed with the IRS.
