For those of you who have never worked the other side of the finish line, the people who organize the races have given their heart and soul. They sacrifice their free time and give back to the sport that gave them so much. Over the past two years, four key race committee members have decided to call it quits. I can't blame them. This race has been ongoing for 18 years. For years, these same people have given countless hours in the months leading up to the race. In fact, with last October's sun/rain/snow/sleet/sun combination, I am surprised that the whole committee did not leave.

So, this is my plea to get some new people involved in the other side of the finish line. Is there a time commitment? Yes. But is it a lot of time? No. Are the jobs fun? YES!

Please attend the special club meeting on January 28th. I will hand out an updated job list. We will also do a role call of the current committee to make sure they are still up to the task.

The Leaf Peepers is really one of the jewels of Vermont. Think of the Vermont City Marathon and think of the Stowe 8-Miler. The Leaf Peepers is in some good company. Let's help make it the 19th annual this October.

The future of the Leaf Peepers races is on the line. Elsewhere in this issue you will find an article by Race Director Curtis Picard outlining his concerns about the management of the races. This is a matter of the gravest concern to those of us who have been involved in the operation of the race over the past four or five years. It should also be a wake-up call to anyone who has run in the races, or hopes to in the future.

The main issue is people – specifically, the lack of CVR members to work the races. While the Harwood Union High School Booster's Club supplies many volunteers, all of the key jobs are filled by CVR members. Some of these folks have worked year in and year out, and in every year for the last four, burnout has claimed two or three of them. Unfortunately, other Club members have not stepped forward to pick up the responsibilities

laid down by the retirees. It is true that a number of you help on race morning with registration or other tasks, but this is not enough. If all Club members choose to run one of the races instead of helping, the event will probably collapse, since there is no other group in the area with the people and experience to run an event of this time.

I hope this doesn't happen. These races are the Club's premier events. Each year they draw a combined total of 900 registrants from all over Vermont and from other places. It would be a pity if Leaf Peepers went by the boards because of a lack of interest on the part of CVR members.

Please plan to attend the special Club meeting January 28 and voice your opinion. I hope you'll also sign up to work on the race.

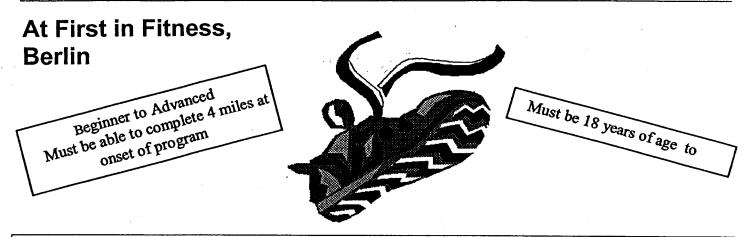

CVR Business Meeting, December 5, 2001

On December 5, 2001, the Central Vermont Runner's Club gathered at the home of Norm Robinson, for one of its periodic potluck suppers and general business meetings. After partaking of the culinary offerings, CVR President Richard Cleveland started the formal business session.

The first item on the agenda was a review of preparations for the First Night 5k on December 31st. Dave Kissner, who is concluding his tenure as the race's director after 7 successful, and often chilly, New Years' Eve races, reported the race was scheduled for 3:00 P.M. following the reconfigured course. up Terrace Street, established in 1999. The Line Ski Company had assumed primary sponsorship of First Night 5k 2001. The Onion River Arts Council would continue to provide much valued assistance. Although David is relinquishing his directorship of this event, the race shall continue in 2002 under the capable leadership of CVR member Rowly Brecken.

Turning to the Onion River Race Series, it was announced that the store's staff has raised the possibility of changing the order of the individual events, but nothing had been decided. Mention of Onion River Sports transitioned the meeting into the scheduling of the 2002 race calendar. The tentative schedule for races, their locations, directors, dates and starting times were decided and are listed at the end of this report.

This calendar entails moving the 10 Miler to Mother's Day, the date of the former Covered Bridges Half Marathon,

switching the Bear Swamp Run to late June to avoid coinciding near the Stowe 8K, and scheduling Berlin Pond a week later than previously at the race director's request. The date for the Lake Winnipesaukee relay race will be announced later.

A report from Jamie Shanley announced a doubling of membership since the summer. He hoped to produce a newsletter before Christmas. Jamie apologized for the long delay between newsletters and expressed a willingness to share the newsletter/membership compilation duties. A discussion concerning the newsletter's future included suggestions the frequency of issues be reduced. Dave Kissner offered that the web might become a transmission vehicle for the newsletter. Dave also suggested the idea of columns from different CVR members, while bob Murphy suggested that perhaps a newsletter committee could be established. Norm commented that CVR members should be encouraged to contribute to the newsletter. Nancy Rice offered to assist in the newsletter's production. The discussion concluded with Dave Kissner volunteering to discuss the newsletter's future with Jamie.
