The CVR summer running activities are well underway with successful events like the Capital City Stampede, Paul Mailman Ten-Miler and the Bear Swamp Run. There are also many runners participating in the weekly Fun Runs. We have a new race on July 30th, the Barre Homecoming Festival Downtown 5K, and a new CVR Track Triple on August 18th. Our Berlin Pond race on August 11th has been changed to five miles and we have the East Montpelier Center Chase Race on August 25th. The fall season will also be full of events starting with the Northfield Savings Bank 5K. Details on these races and the remainder of the fall schedule are on our website. Reports from Race Directors -

Berlin Pond – August 11th. The course is new and will be 5 miles this year. It is a Thursday night race and, if you can volunteer, contact Dot Helling.

Bob Bisson – Barre Homecoming Downtown 5k. July 30th at 12:00. New course, which will finish right before the parade begins, meaning a nice crowd for the finishers. Race is also at a new time this year. Bob has some great sponsors lined up, but still needs some volunteers. If you are interested contact Bob.

Leaf Peepers – Roger Cranse is doing great so far as the new race director of CVR's biggest event, and is on track in planning. However he could use more volunteers to get involved on the various committees. The next planning meeting is June 6th at Roger's house. Contact Roger if you can make it or want to be involved.

Onion River Sports is still giving gift certs, but just to be sure, Michael Chernick volunteered to check with them to verify they will be at the various races with gift certs.

Run Girl Run - Andrea McLaughlin discussed the program and asked for a club donation. She works with 5th -8th graders who participate in the Yam Scram and Race for the Cure. There are a variety of activities and training that Andrea is in charge of coordinating for the girls. The club voted to give Run Girl Run \$250.00 donation. Run Girl Run is sponsored by Blue Cross Blue Shield and the Heart Association.

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2005 VERMONT 100

This year's Vermont 100 Mile Endurance Run and Ride, held on July 16-17, 2005, posted temperatures in the 80's and extreme humidity. One third of the field dropped and times were slowed substantially. A number of Vermonters finished well including our own Rowly Brucken in a time of 19:22:12 for 11th place overall, 10th male and 4th in his age division.

The men's race was won by Paul DeWitt, record holder at the Leadville 100, in a time of 16:14:22. His closest challenger, Rick Hessek of Colorado, was two hours back. The women's race was dominated by Krissy Moehl Sybrowsky of Washington in 18:41:15. Her closest challenger was 2:19 back, Rayna Matsuno of Virginia. Sybrowsky had recently run the Western States 100 in approximately 20 hours and is competing in the Grand Slam of ultrarunning, four one hundred milers in one summer. She will run Colorado's Leadville 100 in August and Utah's Wasatch 100 in early September.

Other successful Vermonters included: Jack Pilla in 18:22:58 (6th overall); Bill Salmon in 19:54:42 (16th overall, 1st senior); Jarett Tighe in 21:14:13; Jim Miller in 23:16:06; and Rik Robert in 26:32:53. Runners finishing in less than 24 hours receive a silver belt buckle. Runners finishing between 24 hours and the race's 30 hour cutoff receive a finisher's plaque. The event's main sponsor is Montrail/Patagonia. Proceeds benefit Vermont Adaptive Ski and Sports. Vermont contributors include Ben and Jerry's, Cabot Cheese and many, many local volunteers without whom the event could not take place.

This year Central Vermont Runners, through the leadership of Betty Rose and Cyndy Cross, ran a very successful aid station at critical mile 95.3 named "Polly's." Sigh Searles ran the Taftville Aid Station at mile 12.3 and yours truly was in charge of Camp Ten Bear, a double medical aid station at miles 44.7 and 68.7. The Northern Vermont Track Club with GMAA successfully operated West Winds at mile 76.7. These runner volunteers were a bonus addition to the non-runner volunteers and will be back next year. Next year will also be the start of a theme contest between aid stations so volunteer now and put on your thinking caps.

What is it?

Central Vermont Runners spring-summer-fall fun runs are held every Tuesday evening, from April through October, during the Daylight Savings Time period. Distances are on an out-and-back course of 2, 4 and 6 miles. Runners and walkers are welcome.

When?

Tuesday evening fun runs start at 5:30 pm sharp. The last run for 2005 will be on October 25. (Join us for dinner at Julio's Restaurant to celebrate the end of the fun run season after the October 25th run!

Please note, however, that timed Fun Runs will not start until the first Tuesday in May; nor can we guarantee that every Fun Run will be timed. Results of these timed fun runs are usually posted in *The World*, a local weekly newspaper.

Location & Directions

Unless otherwise noted, fun runs begin and end at the parking lot of the Vermont State Liquor Control Warehouse at the end of Green Mountain Drive in Montpelier, VT.

- From outside Montpelier on I-89 take exit 8; the first left after the traffic light (for National Life Drive) is Green Mountain Drive.
 - For those not coming by way of I-89, go through downtown Montpelier, and follow signs to I-89. You will eventually be on Memorial Drive. Green Mountain Drive is the first right after passing Montpelier High School on the right.

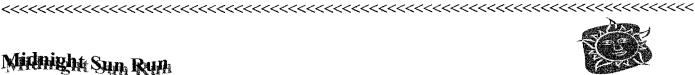

QUEST FOR CVR MEMORABILIA

I have recently approached the Vermont Historical Society about our placing CVR club archives in that organization's collections, and was informed that they would love to be the repository for our materials. Accordingly, Newsletter Editor Nancy Rice has transferred the newsletter collection (which has been building over these past 25+ years) to me for processing and eventual storage at VHS. The newsletter collection is surprisingly complete, although there were some gaps which we hope to fill. Newsletters in the collection are apparently complete for the years 1980-82, 1986-87, 1995 and 2003. Here are some possible gaps in the other years. If you have any issues within these gaps in your own personal files, please forward the original or a copy to me so that our collection will be as complete as possible.

Possible newsletter gaps:

- 1983 Nov (v.4, no.8) was last issue. Any for Dec?
- 1984 Sep-Oct (v.5, no.8) was last issue. Any for Nov-Dec?
- 1985 Nov (v.6, no.8) was last issue. Any for Dec?
- 1988 July issue missing (v.9, no.5)
- 1989 Oct (v.10, no.7) was last issue. Any for Nov-Dec?
- 1990 Jul (v.11, no.5) was last issue. Any for Aug-Dec?

- 1991 Issues for May-Jun (no.2), Aug (no.4), Sep (no.5) missing. Oct (no.6) was last issue. Any for Nov-Dec?
- [Note: From 1992 through 2002 volume and issue numbers not used, making it more difficult to identify missing issues. Accordingly, for those years only gaps are listed.]
- 1992 Gaps for Jan-Mar, May-Jun, Aug, Nov-Dec.
- 1993 Gaps for Feb-Apr, Jul, Nov-Dec.
- 1994 Gaps for Mar, Aug.
- 1996 Gaps for Jan-Feb, Apr, Aug, Oct.
- 1997 Gaps for May, Jul, Oct.
- 1998 Gap for Feb-Mar.
- 1999 Gaps for May, Jul, Oct-Nov.
- 2000 Gaps for Jan-Feb, May, Jul-Oct, Dec.
- 2001 Gaps for Feb-Mar, May-Jun, Aug-Dec.
- 2002 Gaps for Feb-May, Jul-Dec.
- 2004 Sep (v.25, no.4) was last issue. Any for Oct-Dec?.
- 2005 Apr-May (v.26, no.2) is the only issue I have. Was there one between Jan-Mar?

After beginning some basic processing of newsletters (some indexing, for instance), it occurred to me that our archives would be more valuable to future researchers if we were to also include other items. Here are some items that I believe would be good to include:

- Race results for CVR events which have not been published in a newsletter.
- CVR meeting minutes not published in a newsletter.
- Reports on non-CVR events in which we participated as a club (examples: the club meet years ago at Campton, NH; the 24 hour relays at Westport, NY; the RRCA meeting that many of us attended in Portland, ME).
- Newspaper items relating to the club (did anyone save articles published last year in recognition of our 25th anniversary?; how about the battle with Liquor Control agency head Jean Hickey back in the '80's?).
- CVR financial records no longer needed by the current Treasurer.
- Constitution and bylaws (original and each change).
- Photographs taken at CVR events, to include identification, where possible, of the date, the event, and a description of the subject(s) of the photos.
- A brief history of the Club, including officers and committee chairs over the years.
- A brief history of each CVR event, to include race flyers, applications, certifications and other paraphernalia (e.g., I have a brochure on one of the early Leafpeepers races).

Now that you have an idea of how I would like to approach this, I will probably need occasional help with some of the details, particularly in the history area. As I finish each portion of the project, it is my intent to bring those portions to the VHS. I have no interest in keeping all that stuff in my home until the project is complete. After all, part of the reason for doing this is to ensure that these materials will be in a secure place not subject to fire and water hazards and possible loss. Materials such as this will provide future researchers a valuable look back at the running boom's arrival in Central Vermont and the contributions that Central Vermont Runners has made over the years to exercise, health and fitness in our community.

BERLIN POND 5 MILER

WHEN: 6:00 PM, Thursday, August 11, 2005, Berlin, Vermont.

REGISTRATION: \$5.00. RACE DAY ONLY at Berlin Municipal Office Building (Town Clerk's) from 4:30 PM-5:45 PM. To get there take Exit 7 off Interstate-89, turn right at the light, go past Maplewood Convenience Store and gas station, turn right again at the four corners, take next right onto Shed Road. The Municipal Office Building is at end of Shed Road in paved parking lot. To get to the race course, go out Shed Road and turn right, then left onto dirt just after the highway underpass, parking only along the section of road between the turn and the pond intersection, race begins below the pond intersection to the right.

<u>COURSE</u>: A single 5 mile loop counter-clockwise around Berlin Pond, first half hilly, second half flat and fast, all dirt road. Water stop at mid-point. All distances are marked and the course is **USATF-CERTIFIED & SANCTIONED**. Race starts and finishes by pump station at Berlin Pond.

PARKING: Please either park your cars at the Municipal Office Building and jog or walk to the start (approximately ½ mile), or park only along the dirt roadway by the cliffs between the Paine Turnpike and Crosstown Road turnoff and the Pond. Be sure cars are off the road and do not mingle in the roadway. Post race activities back at the Municipal Office Building.

AWARDS: Awards to Female and Male top finishers in the following categories: Juniors (under 19); Open (19-39); Masters (40-49); Seniors (50-59); Veterans (60+). Refreshments at the finish.
