





Minutes of the May CVR Meeting

In attendence: Roy, Linda, Bob Murphy, Andy, Greg, Darragh, Phyllis, Donna, Andrea, Jeff, Richarda, Edisa, Norm.

Approved minutes from the last meeting.

Linda reported on the budget: Expenses more than income this year so far. Donations made to Adamant music school, humane society, Girls on the Run, etc. \$1,822 in donations so far.

One more donation request: Elizabeth from Norwich re: Northfield Track and Field. Runners who desperately need running shoes. Now they don't need shoes but need some end of season things (sneakers, running gear, etc.). Donna made a motion that we get a proposal from her, Bob seconded it.

Update on membership committee: trying to figure out when we can meet. By the next meeting we'll have something to report.

-- Looking around, it was interesting to see the number of younger adults in the race. The race field was definitely younger than a typical Vermont race. I wore my CVR technical short-sleeve shirt. It was my way of saying "I may be old but I'm from Vermont and you'd better look out."

-- I saw someone wearing a t-shirt for the Prescott Senior Olympic Games. I wonder how I could score one of

those? Arizona?

-- I had my finger on my watch ready to go. Then I heard the national anthem being played. I felt sheepish but I have not raced in NC in a couple of years. You don't hear many anthems at Vermont road races.

-- During the race, I noted the number of course monitors (19 turns!) and the number of police officers earning double-time pay. Although it is certainly fun to run in big events, I am glad that CVR can produce quality low-key events.

-- The race started at 7:30 am. That is typical for a NC summer event. The early start is an attempt to beat the heat and to minimize impact on local traffic. In Vermont, I enjoying being able to sleep in and still run a morning race. -- My race strategy was to fly on the brief downhills. On the brief uphills, I was resolved to either maintain or gain position in the field. Most importantly, I had a rule to run away from anyone with noisy breathing, slappy feet or music spilling out of their ears or other orifices.

-- The best thing about an out of town race? I love standing around at the start line in a crowd of people I do not know. And the gun sounds. As we start to run, I realize I am not running with a bunch of strangers. I am

running with "my people." Happens to me every time.

-- If you see someone with a VT shirt around here, it probably stands for Virginia Tech. -- North Carolina is a large state with three very different geographical regions. Asheville is probably the most Vermont-like place in

the state, culture-wise. You would not feel too out-of-place here.

-- Anyway...this is not intended to be a race report. Just an occasion for me to share how proud I am of the quantity and quality of races produced by CVR. Huge thanks to all the race directors and volunteers who make this happen--not to mention the folks who actually show up to run! Our summer race season is starting to wind down. The Berlin Pond 5-Miler is coming up quickly. Then we turn the corner into fall with the NSB 5k, the Sodom Pond Race and Leaf Peeper's Half Marathon and 5k. If you have not yet volunteered at a 2012 CVR event, please consider helping out at one of these fine events. And don't forget to run...

Adamant 20 Miler...

Stowe 8-Miler... Let's get one indisputable fact out of the way right now. It is always hot at the Stowe 8-Miler. I saw a lot of CVR members at the race on Sunday. Off the top of my head, I remember seeing: Nina Changelian, Roger Cranse, Pat Driscoll, Dave Erikson, John Hackney, Sean Murphy, Tim Noonan, Andy Shuford, Charles Windisch and Greg Wight. I believe Sean Murphy was the top CVR member in a spiffy time of 56:34. (In extended family news, Eric Ryea's son Justin ran 48:40...good for 13th overall.) And...Bob and Sue "Never-Met-A-Relay-They-Didn't-Like" Emmons were the second relay team overall and were the first coed team.... Jeff Prescott

Mad Marathon and Half Marathon... I believe most of the field is comprised of visitors from out of state. I did note that sometimes-club-member Steve Burkholder won the Male 60-64 age group in a very respectable time of 3:43:58. (Do you think his tropical training regime is paying off?) Mount Washington Road Race...


The team of CVR members **Susan Emmons**, **Dot Helling** and **Donna Smyers** placed 2nd in the Senior division and 3rd in the Master's division in the USATF national Mountain Running Championship team category. Donna also won the 50-54 division and Dot was 2nd in the 60+ division. Other CVR members notable CVR performances include **Keith Woodward** who won the 60+ division the day after being inaugurated into the Mt Washington Road Race Hall of Fame (see below) and **Rick Evans**, director of Race to the Top of Bradford, running well on his first attempt at the mountain and **Mike Gillis** continued his streak (is it 28 now?). ... From the Mount Washington road race web site...

Keith Woodward, of Stowe, Vermont, won the Mt. Washington Road Race just once, but no one has run this race more often or more consistently. Woodward won in 1983 with a time of 1:06:38, and 28 years later (2011) he set a new age group record for men 60-64, with a time of 1:21:29. Between 1973 and last year, he has completed the race 36 times, the most finishes by anyone ever. He has finished under 1:10 on sixteen different occasions, the second most in that category in the history of the race, and fifteen times in the top ten overall. His personal best was a 1:03:06 in 1985, when he finished second. In 1977, when he placed third in 1:08:15, he led the North Country Athletic Club team to the first sub-6 hour team finish (five runners' combined times) at Mt. Washington.

The Northeast Delta Dental Mount Washington Road Race pits runners against one of the most challenging obstacles in road-racing anywhere in the world: the 7.6-mile Mt. Washington Auto Road, which rises at an average grade of 12 percent to the 6288-foot Mt. Washington summit. The race has attracted Olympic athletes, Boston marathon champions, and the best mountain running specialists in the world to compete in the White Mountains of New Hampshire along with numerous other runners from across the United States and from sixteen other countries.

The Mt. Washington Road Race Hall of Fame recognizes athletes whose exceptional accomplishments in the race have added greatly to the history and stature of the event. Inductees are chosen by a vote of the Hall of Fame committee from a longer list of nominees compiled by December 31 of the preceding year.



The Vermont 100 Miler: Perspectives from a Wife and Crew member By Lisa Brucken

By all accounts, there could be many reasons I'd find myself on a grassy field in Vermont at just past midnight on a Saturday night in July. Lying next to me two twelve year old girls wrapped in blankets talked softly and looked up at brilliant stars, the youngest daughter, at 5, sleeping undisturbed in the car. The quiet night was cool with the sweet smell of summer in the country.

A surreal sight spread before me, an archway with a neon light written in script that read "Finish Line" and a giant timing clock, its orange numbers marking time forward. When we arrived at the grassy knoll the hour read 20 and the minutes ticked on. As the clock turned to 20:29 I saw in the woods past the finish line a lone headlamp, bouncing in a way I recognized. Seconds later I heard my name being called and the quiet of the night was broken as I rushed forward to greet my husband as he crossed the finish line of the Vermont 100. Our older daughter followed, their sleep state broken with the excitement of congratulations.

For me and our daughters, the day had been a long series of "hurry up and wait." We navigated from aid station to aid station with the detailed instructions provided by the race organizers. We saw breathtaking Vermont scenery along the way. We watched other crew members and their methods of support, intrigued by the variety. I lugged Rowly's heavy bag longer distances than I expected due to parking arrangements and made mental notes to insist next time he invest in a bag with wheels. I thought next time we should make t-shirts and write on the car like others. On a rare longer time between aid stations, we enjoyed an excellent brunch in downtown Woodstock, which we thought longingly of at 8:30 pm when the only option I could find was a Cumberland Farms. I had to get creative with the meaning of 'time out' in a car and struggled with my own patience as the girls' own enthusiasm ebbed and flowed.

Yet in between the tediousness of snacks and potty breaks were the special moments when Rowly would come into sight at an aid station. I'd signal the girls and they'd jump up from their books or card game and run to greet him, escorting him back into the aid station. He always had a genuine smile for us, and thanked the aid station volunteers profusely while we refilled his Gatorade, found him what he wanted from his bag and watched with fascination as he stuffed his face with a variety of foods. I always made sure to have a "just us" moment where I asked him quietly if he was really ok, knowing that he would tell me the truth. When he left, he'd always call out "I love you all" before we watched him head down the road to next part of the journey.

My perspective on an event such as the Vermont 100 comes solely from a spectator. I'll never run like that, nor have any desire to. I am not sure I entirely understand why anyone *would* do it. I do know, however, after meeting Rowly in 2006 and watching him run countless races big and small, that it is an essential part of him. I know he has to do it. I know he is who he is and thus, the husband I love, because of his running. I know that 'tapering week' is one of my least favorite times because of how restless he gets. I know that wherever he sees me on a course, he'll stop and kiss me. I know that he runs from a place of deep gratitude for his ability to do so.

And while I'll never fully understand the why, I know I will continue to volunteer at water stops or crew him on long races. Because in the end, at the finish line, there is always that poignant moment of quiet emotion wrapped up in an embrace that's just as important to me as it is to him.


