MINUTES OF MARCH MEETING

The following items were discussed:

- The Howard Bank Race will be handled by Chip Stone and is scheduled for July 17, 1982.
- The Treasurer's report from Roger indicated that \$299.94 was in the Treasury.
- Roger proposed and the group accepted a fiscal year (July to July) for membership and accounting purposes.
- A brief discussion was had concerning the status of the possible involvement of CVR with the Montpelier Track Meet.
- Darragh indicated that Paschal DeBlasio did not want to handle the Berlin, VT Pond Race this year, but that Byron Hill might in conjunction with Cox Cable TV.
- Roger reported that he and Wade Walker would be running the Montpelier Recreation Department Ten-Mile Race, scheduled for June 26, 1982 at 10:20 a.m.

PRIZES (<u>Individuals</u>): Entrants will receive results (overall, age group and club/team results). Many finishers will receive a picture of themself at the race. Specially designed certificates of accomplishment to all finishers. The first 50 runners to reach the summit will receive a loaf of homemade bread. Men's and Woman's winners will receive an engraved silver plated or pewter bowl, a \$50 savings bond and choice of the merchandise. The 2nd and 3rd finishers, followed by the 1st finisher in each age group (male & female), will get their choice of the merchandise. Remainder of the merchandise given out by pulling runners numbers out of a hat. (<u>CLUBS</u>): First 3 finishers from each club will have their times added together, lowest times will place 1st, 2nd, etc. First 3 teams will divide gift certificates valued at \$60 for 1st, \$45 for 2nd and \$30 for 3rd. Likewise, the 1st woman's team and 1st master's team will each divide gift certificates valued at \$45. NOTE: All master's automatically compete in OPEN & MASTER'S catergory's in club competition. So conceivably a master (40+) could be on one of the 3 winning teams and also on the winning master's team.



COURSE: Beginning at the Skyline Drive Toll Gate, 5.3 miles south of Manchester Ctr., on Rte. 7 (Elev. 650') and following the 5.25 mile paved toll road to the summit (elev. 3816'), where the Skyline Inn is located: Food, drink and lodging is available (802-362-1113). There are parking and picnic areas along the course. Each mile will be ACCURATELY marked and water stops are provided.

SHOWERS, AWARDS, AND POST RACE REFRESHMENTS: Will be at the Burr & Burton Seminary, located on Seminary Ave., 3.7 miles north of the toll rd. just off rte. 7, awards about 1:30 p.m.

MISC.: It can be very cold at the summit so be sure to send dry clothing to the finish. This is a Toll Road and the fee is \$3.95 per vehicle, pedestrians not allowed on other days. Call ahead well in advance for lodging. Facilities at the Toll House are very limited. It is up to you to arrange transportation back down although most people that have room are usually glad to help, if you have room offer a ride to other runners. If you park in the Toll House area be sure you park in designated area. Since there will be more runners this year a finish chute will be used so be sure to stay in proper finish position until your # has been recorded and notice who is ahead or behind you in case of a possible mix up. Please don't bother the finish line officials as they are very busy keeping the results in order. Weather during past races has varied from 35° with cold rain to very hot, sunny in the 80° , so prepare yourself for the extremes. Remember the demands on the body running uphill are much higher than for a flat race. I created this race as a runner for runners, it is not a "Big Bucks" race although I've tried to give you as much or more than you receive from the "Big Races". There is not an overabundance of volunteers helping with the race so I ask for each of you to help us. If you could arrive by 10 a.m. to pick up your # or post-enter and try to leave the areas a little cleaner than when you arrived it would be a big help. With a little help from each of you this could continue to be a good race, drop me a line afterwards with your thoughts. Thank you and have a good race!! freed
