

## BRATTLEBORO WINTER CARNIVAL 15K

Home-town favorite Jon Dimick ran away from a field of 120 or so, and took the fourth annual Brattleboro 15 km road race in 43.09. The race is part of week-long Winter Carnival festivities that included everything from breakfasts to ski jumping. Finishing second to Dimick was Tim Eno in a distant 49:45; while Walt Chadwick was third in 49:51.

Our own Bob Murphy ran a strong first face of the year by finishing 15th overall and second in the masters division with a 58:31. He came home with a beautiful engraved plaque and handsome long sleeve sweatshirt. Bellows-Falls native Russ Pickering won the masters for the fourth year in 56:12. Patricia Swim won the women's race in 61:13, another easy win over Diana smith in 64:46. Another note of the greatest importance was my own 56th place finish with a time of 67:18.

#### ANNUAL MEETING REPORT

Neither rain, nor snow, nor threat of sliding off North Street, kept members of CVR from their annual meeting at Darragh Ellerson's home on January 23. You all will be glad to know that Darragh is home and looking good after her operation. Four hardy fools (er, folks), consisting of Jeff Shutak, Merrill Cray, Kim Maloney, and Joanne Fortier braved the sleet and rain to log a few miles prior to the gathering, while the rest of us stayed toasty warm next to the fire.

Darragh opened the meeting by asking for the Treasurer's report. Bob Murphy read a report prepared by Roger Whitcomb who was ill and unable to attend. The highlights showed a balance of \$268.10 currently standing. 1982 showed expenses of \$1,689.02 and deposits of \$1,699.73 for a net gain of \$10.71. Roger noted that the main expenses were the printing of the newsletter - \$329 and tee-shirts at roughly \$165. Also noted was the fact that money from dues didn't cover expenses and that only a successful 10 miler and money from the fun runs kept CVR afloat in 1982.

Because of this fact, and anticipated higher expenses, members decided reluctantly to increase renewal dues to \$4 and keep new memberships at \$7. New memberships were not increased, so not to discourage new runners from joining the club. We felt this would take some of the pressure off the 10 miler and fun runs and enable the club to purchase a new stopwatch and possibly a bullhorn. Two items that are desperately needed. Bob Murphy noted that newsletter expenses alone now run at \$3.50 to \$4.00 per household a year.

Election of officers showed Darragh re-elected for a second year as President, and Jeff Shutak also re-elected as Vice President; Roger Whitcomb will be Treasurer again, and Norm Robinson will be Secretary.

In other business, October 1 was unanimously selected for a charity couples race around Berlin Pond. The charity will be selected at a later date. Last year's race director, Wade Walker, noted that expenses (i.e. tee shirts) cut into charity money and perhaps tee-shirts should be dropped and run the race with zero expenses, so more can be donated. This was enthusiastically endorsed by the members present. 1983's race will be co-directed by Wade and Merrill Cray.

In other race news, mark June 25th down as the date for the Montpelier 10 miler. Also, a new event this summer - the first annual 12-hour relay! Race directors will be Merrill, Darragh, and Norm. Hopes are to run the event on Saturday, August 13 from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. at Montpelier High School track, if they are willing to donate the facility. A good meal and fun afterwards will top off the day if all goes well. We'll let you know more as time progresses.

It was decided to ask for volunteers for monthly fun run directors to ensure smooth running Tuesday events. September and October are open if anyone is interested!?

One final note, Bob Murphy has notified the club that this will be his last year as newsletter editor. This is Bcb's sixth year, I believe, and he has done a superb job. If anyone wants to take over this chore, let Bob cr Darragh know.

After the business meeting we destroyed a pot-luck dinner that would put any meal to shame. To cap off the afternoon, Merrill showed a film or a Ride-and-Tie race out west. For those uninitiated with such an event, (I was until after the film), it consists of two runners and a horse. This particular race was 36 miles through brush, dense woods, and rutted fields. The race starts with one person riding the horse to a pre-determined distance, stopping and tieing the horse. He/she then takes off down the trail running. His/her partner starts the race running and comes up to the tied horse and rides to the next stop, passing the partner along the way. This continues, one riding and passing the partner the other catching up and taking the turn on the horse. The first complete team to finish wins.

Merrill has run two such adventures, and she says a 24-hour relay is tough:
