

CVR ANNUAL MEETING MINUTES

The CVR Annual Meeting was held January 27, 1990 at Jeff and Vicki Shutak's home in Williamstown. Present were Tim Noonan, Sue and Ed Drapp, John Valentine, Norm Robinson, Bob and Lynda Murphy, Duncan Robb, Jeff and Vicki Shutak, Bob Howe and Dana McCarthy.

The 1990 CVR officers elected are Dana McCarthy, President; Norm Robinson, Treasurer; and Sue Drapp, Secretary. The office of vice-president is still open. The executive committee will look into possible candidates. The appointment of committee chairs are as follows: Newsletter - Tim Noonan, Race Standards - Bob Murphy, Scholarship - Bob Howe. A discussion for publicity director followed to alert the public about the club, scholarships, upcoming races and membership recruitment. It was suggested that a mailing be sent to possible club members at races in order to recruit new members.

Norm Robinson distributed the CVR treasurer's 1989 report. The year end balance is \$1,233.48. A complete copy of the report is contained in the newsletter. Norm made a motion to keep dues at \$8 for individuals and \$10 for families. The motion passed.

Bob Howe will continue to advertise the scholarships for a male and female high school runner. A motion by Tim Noonan that CVR award 2 \$200 scholarships and 1 \$100 scholarship was passed by a 6-3 vote. John Valentine will report at a subsequent meeting on how to go about setting up a system for granting monies to area high school track and field teams and also to set up criteria for grant writing.

Tentative races:

Jeff will check with the Rotary to see if they want to have the 5K/1K Run for the Health of It at U32 on the first or second Saturday in May. Also, Jeff will look into the possibility of a 5K race to be held in conjunction with Leaf Peepers Half Marathon. Tim reported that Locomotion Fitness is planning to have a 5K race in late April in Waterbury, and contacted him to see if CVR wanted to help. A motion was made and passed that we will sell a mailing list for \$25 and rent our equipment (e.g. chutes, markers, bullhorn, watches) for \$25.

RRCA Insurance - It was agreed that we would purchase RRCA insurance at a cost of \$2.25 per member and that races would be charged to make up the cost for this insurance. TAC membership was tabled to a later meeting.

TREASURER'S REPORT 1989

This past year was an excellent one financially, with our account \$441.00 ahead of last year at year end. This was primarily due to reduced spending in most areas and not due to increased revenues.

CVR dues were up by nearly \$140.00 to \$635.00. Newsletter expenses were also up \$87.97, with one less newsletter. Mailings, and size 6f editions were up. Membership ended the year at 120.

Most of our races should be recogonized for increased profits. The Capital City Stampede, and The Berlin Pond Couples Race show a decline in dollars but only slightly. In the case of the Stampede the club overpaid the sponsors slightly last year and this was recollected this year but wasn't shown it the race dollars but under a seperate heading (\$28.75). Juniper Hill showed increased participants, but while revenues were up; expenses were up this year due to the certification of the course. The race lost \$51.46 compared to \$52.59 in '88. This will undoubtedly improve in '90.

Misc. expenses were down by approximately \$275.00. 1988 saw the purchase of our printer/timer that was a major expense. This year our expenses were limited to \$77.70 for our race chute, and a gift of \$50.00 to Lilly Jones. We have agreed to purchase two Timex hand watches, but this has not been done yet. They will cost approximately \$3000 each.

Our year-end checking account showed \$1,233.48. I hope to computerize 1990's records should I be re-elected treasurer to give even quicker and more detailed reports. Anyone having any questions on our records feel free to contact me.


NEXT CVR MONTHLY MEETING
