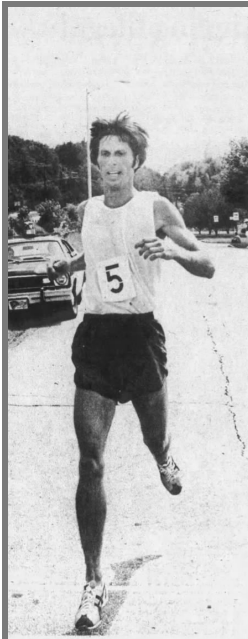


Woodward, Fowler Repeat In Montpelier Road Race

MONTPELIER — Keith Woodward, Mike Canty, Len Hall and Tom Phillips staged a repeat of last year's Montpelier 11 mile Road Race by finishing one, two, three, four in the 1976 rendition here Saturday.

Though the temperatures and humidity were more conducive Saturday than they were in the first annual race last year, when the mercury soared into the high 80's, winner Woodward of East Corinth crossed the finish line three seconds slower than he did last year, finishing in 60:01.

The next three improved their times though, with Canty finishing seven seconds behind Woodward, while Hall came in with a time of 60:30 and Phillips at 61:23. Canty is from Mendon, while both Hall and Phillips are New Hampshire residents, Hall from Littleton and Phillips from Belmont.

The second annual race was run from Montpelier High School, out five and a half miles on the dirt road along the south side of the Winooski River. A five-miler for those runners under 18 was also featured, tracing the same course for two and a half miles. Robert Fowler of Laconia, N.H. also repeated with a first place finish, and like Woodward, ran a slower race than last year. He finished in 26:34, over a minute slower than his time in 1975. Steve Barbour of Montpelier took second with a time of 27:46, while Brian Stafford of Littleton, N.H. was third at 28:11 and Doug Brigham of Montpelier fourth at 28:18.

Donna Raymond, soon to be a senior at Spaulding in Barre, won the five mile in the girls division, finishing at 30:40. She cut almost eight minutes off her fourth place time of last year. Rosemary Hall of Montpelier was second for the girls, crossing the line at 35:55, while Lodiie Brigham placed third and Brenda Mallman fourth.
